Tree Removal

Work will begin this weekend to cut down and remove all the Leylandii trees which make up the hedging on our boundaries; the Trustees have secured an extremely competitive quote for the work which will be carried out by Paul Crabtree.

We have decided to take this action as the conifers have become very tall and intrusive to both of our neighbours so we needed to take action in reducing their height and reach. Having sought advice we felt that to trim and reduce them would leave nothing much more than unsightly bare trunks so we've opted to get rid of them and start afresh - and completely removing them is actually cheaper than pruning them to the extent that would be necessary

We are planning to replace them with native British species which will be provide more biodiversity and more interesting, habitat rich boundary screening.

The Climate Change group led by John Whitton will be discussing all the options in this regard and organising work groups to prepare for and plant the new stock.

Church Cleaning

Appendix - One-off Service

Details of one-off service inside the Main Hall on Sunday 6th September at 10:30.

The safety measures include:

- Registration and contact tracing information
- Specified seating
- Masks worn by all
- No singing
- · People guided in and out and sadly no hanging around
- Hand sanitiser on entry and exit
- One way system
- · All doors and windows open
- · Toilet protocols for emergencies only

The service will be relatively short and include only spoken contributions from the front - eg Bible reading, talk, testimony and prayers. We will use some 'on screen' material and recorded music but there would be no singing; no refreshments and no separate children's or young people's groups. This means any children attending would have to remain with parents at all times.
